You will enter the theatre through the front sliding doors. These doors will take you into the theatre foyer.

If you are here to see a show, you will be greeted by an usher and asked to show your ticket at the door.



If you need to collect or buy a ticket, head through the doors to the Box Office where staff will help you. You may need to wait in a line.

Before the show starts, you can wait in the theatre foyer with your family or friends.



We have a downstairs foyer and an upstairs foyer.

If you would like to go to the upstairs foyer, you can use the staircase or lift.

Please ask a staff member if you need help.

In our upstairs foyer we have a candy bar and balcony seating.



You can wait in the upstairs foyer or balcony with your family or friends, until the show is ready.

While you are waiting for the show to start, you may want to buy a drink or snack from the candy bar. Our main candy bar is located in the upstairs foyer. Our staff will serve you, you may need to wait in a line.

If you need to go to the toilet, the bathrooms are located downstairs. They have signs, “male” and “female”.

There is also bathrooms for people who use a wheelchair or prefer not to use the shared bathrooms.

10 minutes before the show, bells will chime in the foyer to tell you that the show is starting soon. The foyer may be crowded and noisy.

The Civic Theatre has 3 different doors to enter the theatre from. They are called 'Door 1', 'Door 2' and 'Door 3'.

Your ticket will have which door is best to enter through. Please ask a staff member if you need help.

At the door an usher will check your tickets and tell you where your seats are.

Inside the theatre there are red seats. To get to your seat, you may need to walk in front of other people. Other people may walk in front of you to get to their seats also.

When the performance is about to start, the lights will go a little darker. This is now the time to sit quietly and watch the people on stage.

If you need to talk to your friends or family during the show you can whisper.

During the show if you see something that you like or think is funny, you can clap your hands or laugh. Other people sitting by you might clap and laugh at things too.

If any noises are too loud, you can:

- cover your ears
- wear earplugs
- wear headphones

You can ask for free earplugs downstairs at the Box Office.

For some shows there is a small break in between the show - this is called an intermission.

This intermission is a break for the audience and the actors. During this time you can go to the bathroom, buy a snack at the candy bar or stay in your seat until the show begins again.

During interval is a great time to go to the bathroom.

You will find male, female and wheelchair accessible toilets downstairs.

You may need to wait in a line to get into the toilet.

The aisles may be crowded, while others are leaving. You may have to wait your turn to use the aisle.

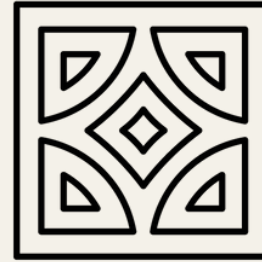
